## **The Church Family**

The annual Congregational Meeting is scheduled for Sunday, December 7, following the worship service. If you cannot attend the congregational meeting, please submit your absentee ballots to Pastor Will or an elder before the meeting. Absentee ballots will be accepted in voting for elder, deacon, and/or the budget. Use one ballot for each item for which you are voting. The ballot for elder should have one name on it. The ballot for deacon should have "yes" or "no" for approval of the nominee. The ballot for the budget should have "yes" or "no" for approval as presented. Place each ballot into a separate envelope and label the envelope with the item for which you are voting (i.e.: elder or deacon or budget). Place the envelopes containing your ballots inside another envelope and write your name on the outside envelope.

Our two offerings on Thanksgiving morning will be a monetary collection for The Luke Society and a non-perishable food collection for the local Food Bank. The Luke Society is a Christian ministry that works internationally with indigenous medical professionals to bring healing and hope through Jesus Christ. They support and empower nationals, as they serve the Lord among their own people, language, and culture, and in doing so, carry out the Great Commission in Matthew 28 to "go and make disciples of all nations."

Next Sunday and the following Thursday, small groups will be optional with the new study material "Why I Believe" by Chip Ingram set to begin.
